Birthday celebrations



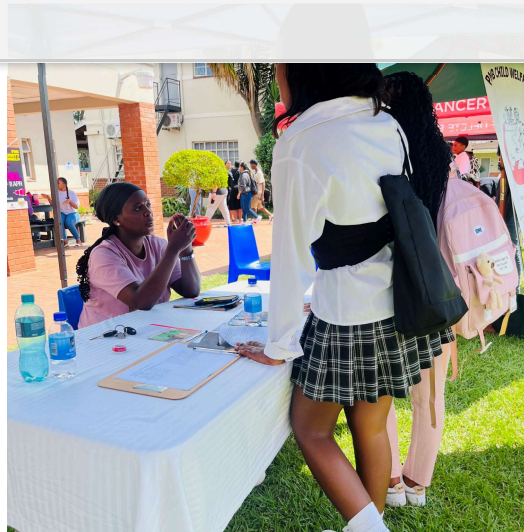
Birthdays are always special for young and old but imagine if you have never celebrated a birthday! For some of our new admissions, this is sadly the case.
